## The History of Daniel Boone and the Oley Valley

Daniel Boone Homestead, the site of the legendary pioneer's birth in 1734, offers a glimpse at early Pennsylvanian life.

Managed by the Daniel Boone Homestead Associates, in partnership with the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission, the site includes 579 acres of land, the Boone House, six other eighteenth-century structures, a lake, picnic areas, and recreational facilities.

In addition to memorializing the life of Boone, the site interprets the lives of the Homestead's later residents, the Maugridge and DeTurk families, as a microcosm of eighteenth-century life in Oley Valley. The Homestead also offers abundant recreational opportunities. Meadows, hedgerows, and woods are a refuge for wildlife. Nature walks and orienteering are reminiscent of the activities that the site's most famous resident surely would have enjoyed.
