

Professional Photography Guidelines

for the Daniel Boone Homestead

1. Purpose

a. The purpose of this policy is to foster a cooperative working relationship with professional photographers and establish guidelines for all parties to help ensure the historic structures and artifacts are protected and all visitors can enjoy their experience at the Daniel Boone Homestead.

2. Hours of Operation

a. <u>Gates to the site are open 9 am – 4pm</u>. Occasionally, due to weather, staff emergencies, etc. the gates may be locked at unscheduled times to protect the site. Before locking the gates, staff will attempt to survey the site and warn visitors that the gates are being locked.

3. Photographer Guidelines

a. Photographers planning to visit the Daniel Boone Homestead for a photo shoot are asked to contact the homestead staff to coordinate the schedule and minimize any interference with visitors to the site or with the photographer and their clients.

b. Photographers desiring to take pictures in the historic area (see map and descriptions), must be aware that access is restricted to paying customers.

c. When on the site, photographers should notify the staff of their presence even if not planning to go into the historic area. This is a courtesy to keep us aware of activities on the site.

d. No visitor or guest is allowed to enter or climb on any of the historic buildings, structures or fences or move any fence, bench or other artifact etc.

e. Photography inside the historic buildings requires advance permission and scheduling to avoid interference with visitors and tour groups.

f. The Daniel Boone Homestead Associates hosts a variety of special events and programs throughout the year. Photography during these events must be coordinated in advance in order to minimize any disruption or interference with visitors and tour groups.

g. Photographers willing to share their pictures for use on our website or social media will be credited.
